

Writing From The Hook

5 Tips To Kick Off Your Next Songwriting Session

"Writing from the hook" is a songwriting technique where the composition begins with the catchiest part of the song. Hooks are often found in the chorus, but a great song will often have multiple hooks placed strategically throughout the song's arrangement.

1. Short, Memorable and Repeatable

- · Can be spoken or sung
- Occupy a predictable number of beats/bars
- *Tip* Write catchy lyrics by borrowing from popular phrases

2. 3 - 5 Unique Notes

- · Usually consisting of diatonic scale steps
- · Often utilizes the pentatonic scale
- *Tip* Count the number of unique notes in popular music that inspires you!

3. Rhythmically Interesting

- Incorporate syncopation
- Clever but not complicated
- Disrupts predictability

4. Utilize Space

- There is a clearly defined ending to the hook
- A chance to breathe and start it over again
- *Tip* Use the hook as an opportunity to change the cadence of your lyric/melody

5. Grab the Listener's Attention

- · Exploit the element of surprise
- Sudden changes in vocal register and large intervalic leaps
- *Tip* Use a mix of short/percussive and long-vowel words
